What is Journalist Post?

Published by the Frankfurt-based International Journalists Association (IJA), Journalist Post is an international magazine that brings to light the professional challenges faced by journalists and all media workers, the human rights violations they encounter, and threats to press freedom. The magazine is published twice a year under the coordination of journalists who volunteer within the IJA. Journalist Post has been in publication since November 2020 and focuses on press freedom and global threats to it.

Preparations for the 8th issue of Journalist Post, which has released seven issues to date, are proceeding at full speed. Published in both print and digital formats, our magazine aims to bring together journalists, editors, academics, media organizations, and communication professionals from different countries on a common publishing platform.

Our Publication Policy and Core Objectives

Journalist Post aims to make visible the common challenges faced by journalists and media professionals beyond geographical borders. In this regard, our magazine:

- Features human rights violations and professional challenges faced by journalists.
- Addresses threats to press freedom and freedom of expression.
- Publishes special reports, investigations, analyses, and interviews.
- Shares the experiences and testimonies of media professionals with the public.
- Examines the transformation between traditional media and new media.
- Discusses current topics such as digitalization, artificial intelligence, disinformation, media ethics, and the future of journalism.
- Evaluates media environments and journalism practices in different countries from a comparative perspective.
- Contributes to strengthening international solidarity among journalists and media organizations.

The magazine's core aim is not only to convey problems but also to foster the sharing of knowledge, experience, and solidarity among media professionals working in different countries. In this respect, Journalist Post continues to be a multilingual publication that follows developments in the media field, defends the fundamental principles of journalism, and serves as an international reference.

International Collaboration

To date, Journalist Post has been produced with contributions from numerous journalists and media professionals from more than 50 countries. In its past seven issues, our magazine has also collaborated with representatives from more than 40 institutions and organizations active in the media sector.

This broad network of participation reinforces Journalist Post's status as an independent and international publication that brings together voices from diverse regions. In addition to the magazine's print editions, the IJA's online publications also reach an international readership.
